Ron King KI7YNN has become a silent key. Following is a note from Ron's wife Judy...



The meeting was called to order by President Bob Sitterley, K7POF, at 12:01 PM MST. There were eight of eight Board Members present: K7POF (Pres. & Treasurer), WN7E (V.P.), K7GH(Interim Secretary), K7BUD, KK7KEN, N7MMC, KG7TTD and KD7RK (previously KI7COM). There were eight present, meeting the quorum requirement of six. There also were several visitors present on the call including W7POF, N7BUD and WAØA. President Bob Sitterley, K7POF, asked if anyone would like the previous

meeting minutes to be read, and everyone was in agreement that the previous meeting minutes would NOT be read.

Election of Officers: The following were nominated and elected unanimously as officers for 2024: President K7POF, Vice President WN7E, and Treasurer K7POF. President Bob Sitterley, K7POF, asked for volunteers and or nominations for the open Secretary position. Bud Winters, N7BUD, volunteered to fill the position. No other volunteers or nominations were offered, there was no opposition to Bud filling the position. A vote was taken and he was unanimously voted as the new Secretary. Board member Jerry Roberts K7BUD asked to resign his position as a board member/Tech Committee, there was no opposition. President Bob Sitterley, K7POF, asked for volunteers and or nominations for an open Tech Member/ board member position vacated by Jerry Roberts. Steve Stock, WAØA, volunteered to fill the position. No other volunteers or nominations were offered, there was no opposition to Steve filling the Tech/ board member position. A vote was taken, he was unanimously voted as a new Tech member. Treasurer's Report: Bank balance, January 7, 2024 is \$16,745.14, Chase Bank, with exception of a possible automatic payment to the power company for the repeaters sites. There was a 62.5% growth in last years bank balance due to the sale of donated ham radio equipment. Previous years balances are approximately as follows:

Report from Technical Committee: The Downtown Phoenix repeater, K7MRG/R is working correctly after K7POF added the PL tone. Most use of it is with an Echo-link connection, K7ARC-R, courtesy of the Phoenix American Red Cross. Also, the Arizona Amateur Radio Club uses it for their weekly net every Thursday except on their regular in person meeting night.

Both the 147.000 and the 442.150 repeaters on Mingus are functioning fine with the exception of weaker signals having a problem with a scratchy signal when the wind is high on the mountain. MMRG is currently considering 2 tower climbers to perform work on the antenna mast which seems to be a loose fit

in the tower. One of the climbers is very busy at this time, and K7POF doesn't have direct contact with the second climber and is waiting for someone to help in contacting him.

K7POF has an Echo-link connection on the 147.000 repeater, but it is not working correctly at this time. K7POF is currently working to resolve this issue. Access to the Echo-link connection is limited to members, and only members that request to have access so we don't have interference with other people that have poor operating practices or a language barrier as this connection would be worldwide if it were open. There are 10 or 12 people now with access to this Echo-link connection. If you want access, send K7POF an email with your request.

The 442.150 Mingus repeater is a Yaesu Fusion DR2X repeater, which works Fusion digital mode as well as regular analog FM and is receiving activity a lot of the time. WN7E has it connected to one of the Fusion rooms, mostly the Texas-Nexus room, although, the Fusion software isn't installed on Tom's new computer yet and Tom, WN7E, said that eventually he will get it going again.

Tom, K7MMC, suggested that the squelch tail be addressed because of the annoying double or triple click at the end of some transmissions.

Old business: The 2023 Picnic was a success. By email vote, the MMRG board elected to make the last Saturday before Mother's Day the permanent date for the MMRG membership Picnic.

New business:

K7POF is still willing to have the membership picnic at the Caliche estates as long as he can count on help from some of the members. There were no motions to have it somewhere else. A vote was taken and passed unanimously. WN7E made a motion to increase the authorized \$300 expenditure to \$400 and KK7KEN seconded the motion. Motion carried.

For door prizes, it was suggested by K7POF to have 5 free memberships for door prizes in lieu of either cash prizes or miscellaneous prizes. KK7KEN made the motion and it was seconded by K7MMC. The motion carried and nobody was opposed.

K7POF mentioned that we are still in need of someone to take over the quarterly newsletter and Steve, WA0A, has volunteered to take it over and keep the website up to date. K7POF wants to continue to do the membership additions.

Each officer was polled about keeping Skype as our means of conducting MMRG business and each officer was in agreement to keep using Skype for meetings.

Other New Business: K7POF asked if there were any more items for this meeting. No other items were brought up.

Adjourn; Ken, KK7KEN motioned to adjourn and it was seconded by Steve, WA0A. K7POF Meeting adjourned at 1:38 PM MST.


