MINUTES FOR BOARD MEETING OF JANUARY 4, 2025, at 12:51 PM MST Skype Meet Now Hosted by MMRG President Bob Sitterley, K7POF

The meeting was called to order by President Bob Sitterley, K7POF, at 12:51 PM MST. There were nine of nine Board Members present along with one guest: K7POF (Pres. & Treasurer), WN7E (V.P.), K7BUD (Secretary), K7GH, KK7KEN, N7MMC, KG7TTD, KD7RK, WA0A and guest, N7ATG. There were nine board members present meeting the quorum requirement of six. There was also one visitor present on the call, N7ATG. President Bob Sitterley, K7POF, asked if anyone would like the previous meeting minutes to be read, and everyone agreed that the previous meeting minutes would NOT be read.

Election of Officers: The following were nominated and elected unanimously as officers for 2025: President K7POF and Treasurer K7POF, Bob Sitterley, and Secretary N7BUD, Bud Winters. As Tom Griswold, WN7E asked to be relieved of the duties as V.P., K7POF, asked for volunteers and or nominations for the open Vice President position. Pat Brower, N7ATG, was nominated by WN7E and seconded by KG7TTD to fill the position. No other volunteers or nominations were offered and there was no opposition to Pat N7ATG filling the position. A vote was taken, and he was unanimously voted as the new Vice President. President Bob Sitterley proposed that the current Board members be re-elected to serve in 2025, K7GH, KK7KEN, N7MMC, KG7TTD, KD7RK, and for WN7E to remain on the board of directors. Bob Sitterley stated that the tech committee consists of Bob, K7POF, Tom, N7MMC & Steve, WAOA, and asked for any objections. There were no objections.

Treasurer's Report: Bank balance, 12/26/2024 was \$19,072.17 at Chase Bank.

Number of current paid members: As of 12/26/2024 - Total 130, Paid 96, Family 29, Comp 9, and of those 9 4 are honorary members, Hartley Gardner W1OQ, Sonja Hazlett WB7CWW, Pat Mathews K7PAT and Jerry Roberts K7BUD.

Report from Technical Committee: The Downtown Phoenix repeater is working OK. Most of the use of it is with the echo-link connection courtesy of the Phoenix American Red Cross. Also, the Arizona Amateur Radio Club uses it for their weekly net every Thursday except on their regular in person meeting night.

Both the 147.000 and the 442.150 repeaters on Mingus are functioning fine. The problem of scratchy signals from the wind has been repaired. Echo-link connection on the 147.0 repeater is on 24/7. Access is limited to only a few people. If you want access to Echo-link, send Bob Sitterley an email.

The 442.150 Mingus repeater is a Yaesu Fusion DR2X repeater, which works Fusion digital mode as well as regular analog FM and is receiving activity a lot of the time. WN7E has installed Fusion software on his new Windows 11 computer, and it is up and running as it should.

Old business: The 2024 Picnic was again a success. The Saturday before Mother's Day will remain the permanent date for the MMRG membership Picnic. For this year it will be Saturday, May 10, 2025.

At the 2024 May picnic, Terry Cook of the Yavapai County Sheriff's Dept Search and Rescue was introduced. He had a request to allow them to install a commercial repeater in our Mingus Mountain Building, also an antenna on our tower. The board considered the proposal and came to an agreement with him on a fee of \$45/month. The repeater was put in service June 22, 2024. In September the board accepted them as permanent tenants until the end of the current contract, June 21, 2025. Also at that time, they paid the remainder of the year's contract in full.

New business:

Because of increases in APS power consumption, Bob proposed to increase the fee to YCSDSR for use of our facilities to \$612/year or an increase of \$6/month. The proposal passed and Bob will contact our tenant and ask for an increase in rent. This has been done and YCSDSR has agreed to the increase.

The membership picnic will continue at 171 Caliche drive Chino Valley, AZ as discussed.

KG7TTD made a motion to increase the authorized \$300 expenditure to \$400 and N7BUD seconded the motion. Motion carried.

For door prizes, it was suggested by K7POF to have 5 free memberships for door prizes in lieu of either cash prizes or miscellaneous prizes as was done years ago. The motion carried; nobody was opposed.

K7POF mentioned that we are still in need of someone to take over the quarterly newsletter and to talk to him if interested. K7POF wants to continue to do the newsletter e-mailing to members.

Each officer was polled about keeping Skype as our means of conducting MMRG business and each officer agreed to keep using Skype for meetings.

Other New Business: K7POF asked if there were any more items for this meeting. No other items were brought up.

Adjourn; Ken, KK7KEN motioned to adjourn, and it was seconded by Steve, WA0A. K7POF adjourned the meeting at 1:26 PM, Mountain Standard time.
